





Spectators are invited to put on a headset and listen to a fabled conversation from past audio recordings, between performer, Sara Moisan and her Father, Gatien Moisan, renowned artist-painter, who passed away in 2019 from brain cancer. Through an autobiographical tale, she portrays the intimate relationship with her father's pictorial works with tenderness and humour, on the meaning of the artist's creations and profound motivations.

She also questions our relationship to the body, illness and death, in addition to the legacy left by the artist after his death. Inspired by the aesthetics of Moisan's works, she retraces the painter's familiar movements through live drawings, artistic video, marionettes and manipulated objects. This emotionally moving presentation is designed for small groups of people for a truly intimate experience.

## TECHNICAL NEEDS

Minimum stage space required:

13 feet deep

16 feet wide

10 feet high

The walls can be either black or white. The stage background must be neutral.

Darkness essential to the production because of video projections.

Autonomous installation in terms of lighting and sound.

Assembly time: 6 hours Disassembly time: 2 hours

Staff required: 1h with the technical director

Specific needs:


3 independent AC cables with extension cords (15 amps)

La Tortue Noire stands out by its ambition to create resolutely contemporary puppet shows. Its artists practice the art of surprising the audience with the originality of their shows which offer a subtle mixture of acting, puppet theater, theater of forms and animated objects. The performer's work also being a central preoccupation for the artists, they constantly explore and reinvent the relationship between the handling of objects and the body of the actor. Founded in Saguenay, in 2005, the company cumulates numerous experiences in creation, research and international touring. It has produced eleven original shows which have been presented in many countries.



A graduate in interdisciplinary arts, Sara Moisan also holds a master's degree in theater from the UQAC. An actress for more than two decades, she has participated in theatrical productions of the Théâtre CRI, the Théâtre 100 Masques, the Théâtre La Rubrique, the Têtes Heureuses and the Théâtre à Bout portant. She has also handled the costume designs in a variety of productions. Puppeteer and actress in the majority of La Tortue Noire's shows, she also was part of the creative team that brought to life shows such as Kiwi, The Witnesses, Daïdalos, Theaters of a Maze, Memento Mori, Memories of an Hourglass, The Other in the City and Ogre. She also adapted, directed and starred in the play The Little Chalk Circle.
